RESOLUTION NO. 88.

2 WHEREAS, the Town of Redmond, Washington is presently embark-  
3 ing upon an extensive program for the installation of sanitary  
4 sewers and has determined that stabilization ponds or lagoons are  
5 the most feasible and efficient method of sewage treatment, con-  
6 sidering all aspects of the present situation; and

7 WHEREAS, the Town of Redmond recognizes its responsibility  
8 for the adequate treatment and disposal of sewage collected in its  
9 said municipal sewer system under existing laws of the State of  
10 Washington, therefore

11 BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council that should efficiency  
12 studies disclose the waste stabilization ponds to be inadequate  
13 as designed, it will require revision, or expansion of the  
14 facilities when so instructed by the Washington Pollution Control  
15 Commission.
