RESOLUTION NO. 1186

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR A WASHINGTON WILDLIFE AND RECREATION PROGRAM (WWRP) **PROJECT** TO THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE FOR **OUTDOOR** RECREATION (IAC) AS PROVIDED IN CHAPTER 79A.15 RCW. ACQUISITION OF **HABITAT** CONSERVATION AND OUTDOOR RECREATION LANDS.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond has approved a comprehensive plan (the Parks, Recreation, and Open Space (PRO Plan) that includes the Bear & Evans Creek Trail & Greenway project; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond approved the 2000 Feasibility Study Report for the Bear & Evans Creek Trail & Greenway project that identified the need for a paved trail from the intersection of Avondale Road and Avondale Way south to Union Hill Road; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of WWRP, state funding assistance is requested to aid in financing the cost of land acquisition for the trail segment identified above; and

WHEREAS, the City of Redmond has received 1989 King County Open Space Bond monies for acquisition and development of the Bear & Evans Creek Trail & Greenway; and

WHEREAS, the City has also submitted a grant application to the King County Conservation Futures Tax Levy Funding program for acquisition funding assistance in the amount of \$203,000, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond considers it is in the best public interest to complete the Bear & Evans Creek Trail & Greenway project; now therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make formal application to the 2004 Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance in the amount of \$203,000.

Section 2. Any funding assistance received as the result of this application shall be used in the acquisition of parcels associated with the Bear & Evans Creek Trail & Greenway.

Section 3. The City of Redmond's monetary share of the project shall be derived from 1989 King County Bond funds and/or King County Conservation Futures Tax Levy Funding;

Section 4. The City of Redmond acknowledges that the City is responsible for supporting all non-cash commitments to the sponsor share should they not materialize;

Section 5. The City of Redmond acknowledges that any property acquired or facility developed with IAC financial aid must be placed in use as an outdoor recreation facility or habitat conservation area and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless as otherwise provided and agreed to by the Redmond City Council, the IAC, and any affected federal agency.

Section 6. This Resolution becomes part of a formal application to IAC; and.

Section 7. The City of Redmond has provided appropriate opportunity for public comment on this application.
