

ORDINANCE NO. 2204

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, ACCEPTING A DONATION OF SELF-CONTAINED BREATHING APPARATUS EQUIPMENT FROM THE KIRKLAND FIRE DEPARTMENT TO THE REDMOND FIRE DEPARTMENT AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND FIRE CHIEF TO CARRY OUT THE TERMS OF SUCH DONATION.

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WHEREAS, The City of Kirkland Fire Department has offered to donate previously used self-contained breathing apparatus equipment to the Redmond Fire Department for use in connection with the Medic One program; and

WHEREAS, RCW 35.21.100 authorizes the City to accept donations by ordinance and to carry out the terms of the donation if such terms are within the City's powers granted by law; and


WHEREAS, the City Council desires to accept the donation according to its terms and to authorize the Mayor and Fire Chief to carry out the terms of the donation; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, DO  
ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:


**Section 1. Acceptance.** The City Council hereby accepts the donation of the self-contained breathing apparatus equipment, shown on the attached list, from the City of Kirkland Fire Department for use by the Redmond Fire Department in the Medic One program. The City agrees to carry out the terms of the donation, as set forth in the attached letter from Kirkland Fire Chief Jeff Blake dated February 23, 2004. The City Council expresses its thanks to the City of Kirkland for its generous donation.

**Section 2. Effective Date.** This ordinance, an administrative action, is not subject to referendum and shall take effect five (5) days after publication of a summary consisting of the title.

Dear John,

Kirkland Fire recently purchased new breathing apparatus for our fire suppression personnel. As a result, we will surplus our replaced equipment, as we have changed manufacturers. Both Departments have discussed the surplus equipment and the possibility of Redmond purchasing it for use on the paramedic units. The estimated value placed on the surplus equipment is \$7,000, which includes a variety of SCBA units and other parts.

Because we are a partner agency in the Northeast King County Medic One Consortium, we feel it would be appropriate for us to make a donation of this equipment to the medic program, as opposed to having the medic program purchase this equipment. We do ask that the surplus equipment be considered an in kind contribution from the City of Kirkland for the efficient and effective operation of the medic one services. We do not have an expectation of this equipment ever being returned to us. If the medic program no longer needs the equipment, it may dispose of it or, if it is sold, we ask that the money received from its sale be invested back into the medic one service.

Working together for a better service continues to be our goal. We believe this donation will improve the level of service provided by paramedics in Northeast King County. Please accept our donation of this equipment for use in serving our region.
