INSTRUCTIONS FOR ONLINE REGISTRATION:

- 1. Login to www.redmond.gov/econnect
- 2. Click on "My Account"
- 3. Enter your Login ID and Account PIN # (if you already have a Client ID & PIN# with your account). If you do not know your Login ID & Account PIN #, please click on "Forgot My ID or PIN," Enter your email address of record, and your Login ID & Account PIN # will be emailed to you immediately.
- 4. Click on "Classes"
- 5. Enter the Youth Basketball Class number which is #41690 and choose "Youth Basketball"
- 6. Click on the "Add" button, and select your child's name from the drop-down menu.
- 7. Click on "Checkout"
- 8. Please answer all the prompts and pay with a bank card (MasterCard or Visa only)
- 9. Please make sure you have read and agree with the liability waiver prior to registering

TEAM ASSIGNMENTS (GRADES 1-5)

Teams are assigned by The Parks & Recreation Department. Teams in this league will be assigned according to each child's grade level, and the school they attend. We try to keep all children at their home school but there is always the possibility that they may play for a neighboring school if there are not enough, or too many kids registered from their home school for one team. If there are enough kids from your child's grade and school to form more than one team, we will split the players up into teams randomly. There are no "buddy requests" but we will keep same gender siblings together upon request.

TEAM ASSIGNMENTS (GRADES 6-8)

Teams are assigned by The Parks & Recreation Department. We will try to assign teams according to the school each player attends. If more than one team from a school then there will be a draft. There are no "buddy requests" but we will keep same gender siblings together upon request.

Note: Volunteer coaches must inform the league director before the conclusion of registration (October 4th) if they are planning to coach with someone else. We will assign each head coach ONE assistant coach and their child upon request, but cannot guarantee multiple assistant coaches.

Practices will begin the week of November 5, 2012. Assigned Coaches will call team members after the coaches meeting. Coaches will inform you of your scheduled practice time and location once they receive team rosters and practice schedules. Teams will be assigned a one-hour practice once (possibly twice) per week. Games will be scheduled for Saturdays beginning December 1, 2012. The season will run approximately through February 23rd or March 2nd, 2013 (final dates will be on the game schedule). There will be no games on December 22nd or December 29th.

PARENTS' CODE OF CONDUCT

I hereby pledge to provide support, care, and encouragement for my child in youth sports by following the Parents' Code of Conduct.

- I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, and officials at every game, practice or other youth sporting event.
- I will place the emotional and physical well-being of my child ahead of a personal desire to win.
- I will remember that the game is for youth, not adults.
- I will do my best to make youth sports fun for my child.
- I will support coaches and officials working with my child in order to encourage a positive and enjoyable experience for all.
- I will ask my child to treat other players, coaches, spectators, and officials with respect regardless of race, sex, creed or ability.
- I know that it is my child's right to play in a safe and healthy environment.
- I know that it is my child's right to play in a sports environment that is free of drugs, tobacco, and alcohol, and will refrain from their use at all youth sports events.
